Mayor of Seoul
Park Wonsoon

Referred to by many people as a “social designer,” Park Wonsoon dedicated his career to bringing about fresh change to old norms. Park worked as a human rights lawyer and defended many political activists in the 1980s and 1990s. In the 1990s and 2000s, Park as a civic activist founded several civic organizations formed with the purpose of promoting participatory democracy and securing human rights, a foundation with the aim of promoting a culture of philanthropy, and a think-tank with the goal of applying policy alternatives based on the ideas of ordinary citizens. Since his first election in October 2011, Park has now served his third term as the longest-serving Mayor of Seoul. He set forth the slogan “the citizens are the mayor” and pursued collaborative governance with the citizens in the policy decision making process. Park as a mayor realized the importance of going beyond national borders and strengthening city-to-city cooperation when tackling the many common challenges that the world faces.

Governor of Jakarta
Anies Baswedan

Anies Baswedan was inaugurated as the Governor of Jakarta for 2017-2020 term on October 16th, 2017. Before assuming office. Mr. Baswedan served as Minister of Education & Culture of Republic of Indonesia in the Joko Widodo administration from 2014 to 2016, and as rector of Paramadina University from 2007 to 2015. Mr. Baswedan is the recipient of the 2010 Nakasone Yasuhiro Award from the Institute for International Policies Studies in Japan. He has been also named as one of the World’s Future Figures by Foresight Magazine, Japan in 2010 and as one of the 500 Most Influential Muslims by the Royal Islamic Strategic Studies Centre in 2010. Mr. Baswedan received Ph.D in Political Science from Northern Illinois University, an MA in Public Management from the School of Public Policy at the University of Maryland and a BA in Economics from Gadjah Mada University in Indonesia.



Mayor of London
Sadiq Khan

Sadiq Khan was elected Mayor of London in May 2016, winning the largest personal mandate in the history of British politics by securing the support of 1.3 million Londoners. Prior to becoming Mayor, Sadiq was the Member of Parliament for Tooting in South London for 11 years. During this time, he attended Cabinet and served as Shadow Secretary of State for Justice from May 2010 and Shadow Minister for London from 2013. As Mayor, he has said that London’s recovery from Covid-19 must ensure that nobody is left behind, and no one organisation or sector can tackle these challenges alone. He is currently working with UK Government, businesses and civil society to ensure London's economic and social recovery isn't a return to 'business as usual,' but embraces a renewed drive to address inequalities and the climate emergency.



Governor of Maryland
Larry Hogan

Governor Lawrence J. Hogan, Jr. was sworn in as the 62nd governor of the State of Maryland on January 21, 2015. In 2018, he was overwhelmingly re-elected to a second four-year term, receiving the most votes of any Maryland gubernatorial candidate and becoming only the second Republican governor to be re-elected in the 242 year history of the state. In his first inaugural address, Governor Hogan reminded citizens of Maryland’s history as a state of middle temperament and pledged to advance the best ideas, regardless of which side of the political aisle they come from. He is recognized nationally as a strong, independent leader who consistently delivers real results and achieves common sense, bipartisan solutions.



Mayor of Moscow
Sergei Sobyenin

Sergei Sobyenin was born in Nyaksimvol village in the Khanty-Mansi Autonomous District. From 1982 to 1984 worked as a director in district committee of Chelyabinsk. In 1989 got a second degree in jurisprudence. In 1991 was elected as a mayor of Kogalym. Since 1993 - the First Deputy Head of the Administration of the Khanty–Mansi Autonomous district. In 1994 was elected as a chairman of the Khanty–Mansi Duma, a member of the Federation Council of Russia, chairman of the Constitutional Law, Judicial, and Legal Problems Committee. In 2000 was appointed the First Deputy Plenipotentiary of President of Russia in the Urals Federal District. In 2001-2005, he was the Governor of Tyumen Region. In November 2005 was appointed a head of the Administration of the President of Russia. In 2008 was the Vice-Chairman of the Government of Russian Federation – Head of Executive Office of the Government of Russian Federation. Since October 2010 is the Mayor of Moscow.

SEOUL STATEMENT

Seoul Statement will be a formal initiative by Park Wonsoo, the mayor of Seoul, for solidarity and cooperation against the epidemic. Please find the following Seoul Statement:

Seoul Statement

June 2, 2020

□ Our Present Day

We are living in the era of cities. However, cities are now facing a crisis. With the global outbreak of COVID-19, citizens' lives are under threat and the very existence of cities is at stake. Cities offered a place for civilization to be born and bloom, but now carries risks and danger. We, in each and every city, are striving hard to resolve our common task which is to overcome this crisis caused by coronavirus.

Witnessing the worldwide transmission of COVID-19, we reaffirmed the fact that viruses know no border or nationality and that they are highly infectious in cities where numerous people live in close quarters.

□ Our Vision

We aim to build cities where citizens can lead a safe and healthy life under the safeguard of prompt responses to and thorough prevention from infectious diseases. It will help us find the key to addressing an infectious disease when cities around the world precisely design a disease control manual together, implement organized preventive measures, and strengthen city resident's capabilities to deal with infectious diseases based on the well-placed public healthcare system while sharing each city's experiences built up over the course.

□ Our Solidarity

We agree that solidarity and cooperation among municipal governments is the most effective way to respond to an infectious disease. Today, we, at the Mayoral Meeting of *the Cities Against COVID-19 (CAC) Global Summit 2020*, share countermeasures to infectious diseases and ultimately wish to build a healthy city through unwavering city-to-city cooperation.

An unknown path is about to unfold ahead of us. This path will lead us to a world where we have to learn how to live with viruses. It surely is not an easy one to take, but we believe that only if we take a step on the path with our hands joined together, the path will be explored rather safely.

□ Proposal for Building an Intercity Network

Understanding a general agreement on the necessity of city-to-city solidarity, we wish to build an intercity network which enables prompt joint responses to emerging infectious diseases in an effort to:

1. Detect an infectious disease at an early stage and cooperate on preemptive responses.
2. Share information on an infectious disease with the partner cities and make efforts for joint practice.
3. Provide human/material resource support to the partner cities upon the outbreak of an infectious disease.
4. Cooperate in the people-to-people exchanges to nurture a specialized workforce fighting against an infectious disease.
5. Reduce barriers to travel and economic activities between cities to overcome socioeconomic crises caused by an infectious disease.
